



4-H/FFA Changes for 2021

Please note the following changes to the schedule/fair book for 2021.

General/Auction

- No entries will be accepted after Monday, July 19 at 4:30 PM.
- All premium checks must be cashed in within 90 days of being received. No checks will be reissued.
- There is a \$50 stalling deposit required for each exhibitor to receive an exhibitor number (checks only). If stalls are cleaned and checked out by superintendent by 3:00 pm Monday of the auction (unless special arrangements with a Fair Board member), the stalling deposit will be shredded. Failure to do so will result in loss of \$50 stalling deposit.
- Early removal of any exhibit will result in a forfeiture of the stalling fee and may affect eligibility to show at future fairs.
- **Stalling will be based upon the number of head brought, not the number of head entered. No tack space is guaranteed.**
- If an animal's health is in question, it will be asked to be removed and will not be eligible for auction.
- No private sales are permitted to be transported by the truck. If animals are not going through the auction you must make your own transportation arrangements.
- **Exhibitor number pick-up will be on Wednesday, July 28 from 4:00-6:00 PM at the fair office.** (This is a new designated time to pick up your exhibitor number, pay your stalling deposit, and any outstanding fees).
- Earn an Extra \$10 towards your 4-H enrollment fee by helping at two out of the three clean up days. Must check-in and check-out to receive credit.
- **ALL LIVESTOCK WILL BE INSPECTED PRIOR TO BEING UNLOADED. Any health discrepancies will be dealt with by a fair vet and may be sent home. Any health issues found may require all animals of the same species in that trailer to be sent home. Rabbit and poultry inspection will be in the barns. ALL other species should enter staging in the South Parking lot.**
- **ALL BEEF, DAIRY, SHEEP, GOAT, HORSE, and SWINE COMING ON THE GROUNDS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE HEALTH PAPERS. SWINE papers must be within 7 days, SHEEP must be within 14 days. BEEF, DAIRY, GOAT, and HORSE must be within 30 days of check in. Rabbits and poultry do NOT need health papers. Poultry will need to have Pullorum-Typhoid testing.**

Beef/Dairy

- Check-in is from 7:30 – 9:00 AM Wednesday, July 28.
- Tack drop off and set-up is from 5:00 – 7:00 PM Monday, July 26.
- All beef must check-in or cross the scale during the check-in period. Failure to do so will result not being checked-in and not in any programs.
- Cattle tie stalls must be cleaned by pulling bedding away from the wall 5 feet, and any cattle pens must be scooped clean and manure hauled to the closest bunker; failure to do so will result loss of stalling deposit.

Sheep

- **Check-in is from 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM Wednesday, July 28.**
- All pens must be scooped clean and manure must be hauled to the closest bunker, failure to do so will result in loss of stalling deposit.
- **ALL SHEEP HEALTH PAPERS MUST BE DATED NO MORE THAN 14 DAYS PRIOR TO EXHIBITION.**

Swine

- **Check-in is from 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM Wednesday, July 28.**
- All pens must be scooped clean and manure must be hauled to the closest bunker, failure to do so will result loss of stalling deposit.
- **ALL SWINE HEALTH PAPERS MUST BE DATED NO MORE THAN 7 DAYS PRIOR TO EXHIBITION.**
- As of now, we do not have a buyer for the hogs after the Hancock County Fair. The buyer from last year's fair has gone Paylean free, and at this time, is not taking any county fair hogs. We are still exploring other buyers and will keep you informed of any changes. However, please be prepared that the Hancock County Fair might be non-terminal for 2021.

Goat

- **Check-in is from 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM Wednesday, July 28.**
- All pens must be scooped clean and manure must be hauled to the closest bunker, failure to do so will result loss of stalling deposit.

Horse

- **Check-in for county exhibitors and district exhibitors stalling is from 8:00 – 11:00 AM on Wednesday, July 28.**
- Stalls/pens must be scooped clean and manure must be hauled to the closest bunker, failure to do so will result loss of stalling deposit.
- You will get 3 calls to enter the arena before being scratched.
- You will have 1 minute and 30 seconds to enter the arena to start your event after your 3 calls.

Poultry

- **Check-in Tuesday, July 27, 4:00 PM-6:00 PM.**
- All poultry will need to have Pullorum-Typhoid testing to be eligible to show. More details on a testing date and time to come.
- Latches for safety are allowed but MUST be cleared with superintendent PRIOR to placement. If not, they will be removed if needed.
- All cages must be taken out of the barn, washed off, and have all garbage/debris removed. If your cages are along the wall you must pull all "bedding" away from the wall 3 feet. Failure to do so will result loss of stalling deposit.
- **Appropriate food and water dishes must be used. If poultry are found without food or water the exhibitor will be found to fix the problem. If the problem persists, the exhibitor will be asked to take the animal home and not be eligible for auction.**

Rabbit

- **Check-in Tuesday, July 27, 5:00 PM-7:00 PM.**
- All cages must be taken out of the barn, washed off, and have all garbage/debris removed. If your cages are along the wall you must pull all "bedding" away from the wall 3 feet. Failure to do so will result loss of stalling deposit.
- **Appropriate food and water dishes must be used. If rabbits are found without food or water the exhibitor will be found to fix the problem. If the problem persists, the exhibitor will be asked to take the animal home and not be eligible for auction.**
- Latches for safety are allowed but MUST be cleared with superintendent PRIOR to placement. If not, they will be removed if needed.
- No SELLING of rabbits on the fair premises. You may advertise your rabbitry with ONE sign and have decorative name tags. You may not list your rabbits for sale or bring unidentified rabbits on the fairgrounds to sell.
